

Beach Report Off Leash Beaches:

- Ocean Beach Dog Beach
- Coronado Dog Beach
- Del Mar Dog Beach
- Fiesta Island on Mission Bay



On-Leash Beaches:

- <u>San Diego</u> city-operated beaches are <u>all</u> open to leashed dogs in the morning before 9 a.m. and in the evening after 6 p.m. (after 4 p.m. November to March). This makes San Diego one of the most dog-friendly cities in Southern California!
- <u>La Jolla</u> is a district within San Diego so they follow the same rules allowing leashed dogs in the mornings and evenings (ok before 9am and after 6pm).
 This does <u>not</u> include the beaches at Torrey Pines State Beach.
- Mission Bay Park is a San Diego Park with many individual parks and beaches and all of them follow the same municipal rules for leashed dogs in the mornings and evenings (ok before 9am and after 6pm).
- <u>Coronado</u> has different rules, but they have a couple options. In addition to their awesome off-leash <u>Dog Beach</u>, they have a little-known park with a narrow bayside beach that is excellent for leashed dog walking, <u>Grand Caribe</u> Shoreline Park.
- Imperial Beach allows leashed dogs on the beach south of Imperial
 Beach Boulevard on South Imperial Beach. There is also a small area of the
 main IB City Beach north of Palm Avenue that is open to leashed dogs (access
 at Carnation Avenue). Additionally, there is a long stretch of sandy beach in
 front of Tijuana Slough National Wildlife Refuge which can be accessed from
 the south end of Seacoast Drive.
- <u>Del Mar</u> has different dog rules for each of their beaches. <u>South Beach</u> is open to leashed dogs year-round. <u>Del Mar City Beach</u> allows dogs on leash between Labor Day and June 15th (not allowed the rest of the year). And of course, they have their off-leash area at <u>North Beach</u>.
- <u>Solana Beach</u> allows dogs off leash south of the staircase at <u>Del Mar Shores</u> <u>Beach Access</u>.
- <u>Encinitas</u> has strict rules prohibiting dogs on their beaches, but <u>Seaside Beach</u> at <u>Cardiff State Beach</u> allows dogs if they are on leash.
- Carlsbad unfortunately has zero options for taking your dog to the beach.
- Oceanside is another unfriendly city for dog owners who want to let their
 pooches splash in the saltwater. Luckily there is one option at San Onofre
 State Beach if you are willing to pay for entry and hike down to the beach. At
 the Bluffs Beach area of this state park they allow dogs on leash at beaches
 number 1 and 6. It's quite a drive from Oceanside as the park is north of
 Camp Pendleton, but it's a great park and worth the effort.

Remember to keep your pet hydrated and be aware of hot ground temperatures where dogs can injure or burn their pads.

San Diego has a year-round flea season, and at CPC we recommend monthly flea, tick and heartworm prevention!

Heartworm Disease

Heartworm disease is an emerging as more of a concerning disease. The saying is that if you live in the South Eastern portion of the US, and your dog is not on heartworm prevention, it probably has heartworm disease. Heartworm disease is spread by mosquitos which are not as prevalent in San Diego as in the South. However, transportation of animals due to adoptions, shelter housing restrictions, and rescue efforts from natural disasters are causing a higher influx of heartworm disease to our state. Last year CPC diagnosed and treated two heartworm positive dogs. We recommend heartworm prevention be given on a strict monthly schedule to help prevent transmission of this nasty parasite.

Teahupoo Spirelli, (pronounced "cho- poo") is a 4 year old male Coton De Tulear who stoically underwent ACL repair surgery(called CCL in veterinary medicine-cranial cruciate ligament) on his right knee at Companion Pet Care. He was a champion for the procedure and is an example that, despite a major injury, it is possible to always be in a bright, happy, tail wagging spirit. To aid in his recovery we also injected platelet rich plasma (PRP) into the surgical knee, as well as his other knee. Statistics show that after one CCL rupture, there is a 50% chance of the other rupturing within one year. We salute you for your braveness and keep up the good work, Teahupoo!
